The Year is Already Flying By!

Dear Grads and Families,

It's hard to believe it has been two months since the first newsletter and our Parent Info Night! Our Grads have finished first term and are now on the downward slope towards the end of first semester. That also means a few more important dates and deadlines coming up in preparation for graduation.

On Tuesday, November 28 we sent a form out to Grads via Teams to send in their sizing information for cap and gown ordering. This also means that we have started to collect commencement fees. The \$75 commencement fee includes the purchase of the graduation regalia (cap and gown), their sitting fee for grad photos, and miscellaneous costs related to commencement. Please pay the fee by December 22nd. It can be paid by debit/credit.cash/cheque in the main office or by e-transfer to timberline.accounting @sd72.bc.ca.





This course is delivered online to our Grade 12s via Teams and is a requirement for graduation. Grade

12s should have completed all first term assignments by November 1st, and would have received a comment indicating their progress on the Term 1 report card. On December 1st, their Capstone Proposals are due, where they outline their plans for their Capstone Projects. Projects should be completed and handed in by January 15th so that they can be assessed for the Semester 1 report card. Students will then present their Capstones to a mentor prior to Spring Break.

Grad photos are on January 31 and February 1, and a draft schedule is currently being developed and should be given to Grads in early December.

Closer to the photo date, information regarding what to wear/how to prepare for your photo session will be sent out. Please note: You may bring a small personal item to your photo session but no pets are allowed at school-based photos.
