National Film Board:

TV shows, films and shorts from across Canada featuring Indigenous creators and/or content.

<u>Waseteg</u>

Waseteg is a short animated story of a young Mi'kmaq girl discovering dreams, courage, identity, creation and embracing her Elders.

Wapos Bay

This charming and humorous stop-motion series looks at contemporary life in a Cree community.

<u>The Mountain of</u> <u>SGaana</u>

A Haida tale of a young man who is stolen away to the spirit world, and the young woman who rescues him.

Maq and the Spirit of the Woods

This animated short tells the story of Maq, a Mi'kmaq boy who realizes his potential with the help of unexpected mentors.

Little Thunder

A humorous short inspired by the Mi'kmaq legend "The Stone Canoe". Follow Little Thunder as he sets out on a cross-country canoe trip to become a man.

<u>Qalupalik</u>

An animated short of Qalupalik, a part-human sea monster that lives deep in the Arctic Ocean and preys on children who do not listen to their parents or elders. Available in English and Inuktituk.

<u>Dancers of the</u> <u>Grass</u>

Stop-motion short that vividly depicts the majesty of the hoop dance, a tradition symbolizing the unity of all nations.




