## Traffic Lights Comprehension Monitoring

## Before you go:



This strategy will help students with identifying what they understand and where they may need to use a strategy to improve understanding. This skill is critical to have before learning how to do other strategies. If students are aware of what they do and do not understand, then they can select the right strategy to help.

## Materials:



- short story or news article from Sora or Newsela - printed off
- 1 red pen or highlighter (pink is fine)
- 1 yellow pen or highlighter
- 1 green pen or highlighter
- Pen or pencil

On the Road:

1. As you read, keep track of what you do to make sense of the text.
2. Make notes or write symbols, called annotations, to show where you used a strategy.
3. After reading, go back and:
a. Highlight the parts you "get" or can summarize in green.
b. Highlight the parts you mostly understand yellow.
c. Highlight the parts you "don't get" or understand in red.
