Ripple Rock staff invites families to join us for an Open House on Thursday, September 25th.



Daily Attendance

Thank you for sending your lovely children every day. We appreciate the opportunity to work with them and support their learning. We encourage consistent attendance because learning activities are planned to follow one day into the next. Teachers work hard to make up for missed days but it can be hard for the child to fill in the gap.

We know illness and family matters can sometimes require students to be away from school. For all other circumstances, we want to have them here!

Ripple Rock has a very high absentee rate. We are hoping that we can work together to have all children at school more consistently this year.

Did you know:

- Students can attend if they feel well enough to be at school. They do not need to stay home until all symptoms of colds are gone if they feel well.
- If your student misses 2 days a month, that is 20 days per year, which equals a month of learning time. From kindergarten to grade 5 that would be 6 months of learning time missed.
- We LOVE seeing your children every day!
- We would like to work with you to solve any problems that is making it hard for your child to attend regularly.

Messages During the Day

With a school of over 300 students, the Ripple Rock office is an incredibly busy place. We are happy to get messages to your child during the day if plans have suddenly changed for the end of the day. We are hopeful that most of the time students/staff members know where children are going at the end of the day prior to their arrival in the morning.

If someone calls you from the school during the day and you see our number has called, if it is important, they will leave a message or call you back. We won't be able to track down where the call came from.

Parking Lot and Road Safety

Safety for students and adults is so important to us. The road and parking lot get so busy at the beginning and end of the day. We encourage cars to follow the posted speed signs and only park where permitted. The red line/bus zones are for drop off, not stopping. Please remind students to use sidewalks and cross at crosswalks. Most students are not tall enough for reversing cars to see if they walk behind them so please be extra cautious. Thank to you everyone for ensuring we are all safe on the road at the busiest times of day.



FAIR NOTICE FOR PARENT COMMUNITY Behavioural Digital Threat Assessment (BDTA)

What Parents and Students Need to Know

- any threat must be reported to the school principal
- investigation may involve the student services counselor, the school psychologist, the police or other community agencies
- investigation may involve locker or personal property searches
- interviews will be held with the threat maker and other students or adults who may have information about the threat
- parents of students who are directly involved will be notified
- threatening behaviour may result in disciplinary action
- an intervention plan may be developed for the student making the threat and a support plan developed for any individuals targeted by threats

What is a threat?

- an expression of intent to do harm or act out violently against someone or something
- may be verbal, written, drawn, posted on the Internet or made by gesture.

Duty to report

To keep school communities safe and caring, staff, parents/guardians/caregivers, students and community members must report all threat-related behaviours to the school principal.

What is the purpose of a student threat assessment?

The purposes of a student threat assessment are:

- to ensure and promote the emotional and physical safety of students, staff, parents, the student making the threat, and others
- to ensure a full understanding of the context of the threat.
- to understand the factors contributing to the threat maker's behaviour
- to be proactive in developing an intervention plan that addresses the emotional and physical safety of the threat maker
- to promote the emotional and physical safety of all.

What behaviours warrant a Behavioural Digital Threat Assessment to be initiated?

A student threat assessment will be initiated for behaviours including, but are not limited to

- serious violence or violence with intent to harm or kill
- verbal/written threats to harm/kill others (clear, direct, and plausible)
- online threats to harm/kill others
- possession of weapons (including replicas)
- bomb threats (making and/or detonating explosive devices)
- · fire starting
- sexual intimidation or assault
- · gang related intimidation and violence.

Can I refuse to participate in a student threat assessment?

It is important for all parties to engage in the process. However, if for some reason there is reluctance to participate in the process by the person of concern or parent/caregiver, the threat assessment process will continue in order to promote a safe and caring learning environment.

Collection Notice

The School District is subject to personal information privacy laws, and will undertake the collection of this information in compliance with the requirements of such laws, including by limiting collection to information that is relevant and necessary to address a risk or threat and by ensuring that information is collected from online source is only obtained from open source sites. The School District will not collect information as part of a threat assessment unless there is reason to believe that a risk exists. Information collected as part of a threat assessment may be provided to law enforcement authorities in appropriate circumstances.
