Special Guest:

Lori Kobelak visited to explain the International Student Program. We currently have approximately 25 students in Carihi and 20 students in Timberline. Some stay for one term, others can stay up to four years. The students pay a fee to be here, depending on the amount of time they are staying in CR. The bulk of kids are in highschool, although we have accepted younger kids as well. They are not required to know English before coming to our school district, but it is preferred that they have an intermediate understanding of the language.

They are billeted with host families, ideally with families that have kids of the same age. There is a 5 page application form to fill out, as will there is an inspection of the home done to meet safety requirements and an interview with all family members. The requirements of a billeting family are to have internet, a private bedroom, school bus access, and a quiet study area available to students at all times. You receive \$750/month to host a student. They will be recruiting new host families soon, there will be an information meeting on **Feb 22nd at 7:00pm** in the library at Timberline Secondary. One way of doing a "trial run", would be to be a respite family for those already hosting students and need to find somewhere for their student short term, do to a trip away, etc.

The largest group of exchange students come from Taiwan and Japan. Germany is the second largest group as approximately 20% of the population studies abroad. Next year we have 25 returning students.

The school supports the exchange students with ESL classes in school and after school programs. As well activity programs are run out of the school calendar.
