
ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNING

"A picture is worth a thousand words" is a common phrase, but one that is true for all language learners.

The Picture Word Inductive Model (PWIM) is a well-established method that can be incorporated into in-person as well as virtual classrooms.

This method allows students to access prior knowledge, supports vocabulary development, and involves listening, speaking, reading, and writing.


