

Did you know that we have a new Sexual Health Educator in the community?



ADOLESCENT LITERACY

Purpose

Deepen thinking, synthesize & organize ideas: structure text-based discussion

Application

After reading non-fiction text, small groups of students take turns thinking and making notes on each "C", then take turns sharing their thinking.

How to start

Teach one "C" at a time by first defining it, then modelling it in a think-aloud, then practicing as a whole class, gradually releasing responsibility to students. When all students can do the "C", allow groups of 3-4 to work together to process what they have read. This is called the "I do, we do, you do" instructional model.
