# **Board Considers Process for Naming and Renaming Schools**

Chairperson Kat Eddy presented the board with a notice of motion for a newly proposed board governance policy on naming and renaming schools.

## **Quarterly Finance Report Shows Revenues Up**

Secretary-Treasurer Kevin Patrick presented the board with a quarterly financial report as of September 30, 2023.

Revenues were up 15 percent because of the slight increase in enrollment and the district's receipt of one-time Ministry grants. Expenses are up by three percent because of summer work, preparation for school start-up, and increased benefits. Benefits continue to track over budget because of wage increases, inflation, and employees being able to once again access benefit services post-pandemic.
