CROSS CATCHMENT TRANSFER

Applications for Cross Catchment transfers are due for consideration by the last Friday in February (February 28th), Please note that students must be registered in their area school before applying for a Cross Catchment Transfer. The forms can be found on the District website. This also applies if your child will be going into the English Program at Phoenix or Southgate rather than continuing in the French program at Phoenix.

French Immersion Transfer

Moving a student from one program to another requires careful consideration. The French Immersion program is inclusive of all learners and school teams work to support all students so that they successfully complete the French Immersion program. A student or parent can request to move out of the French Immersion program by speaking with the school principal (or a school counsellor at middle or secondary school).
