MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 72 (CAMPBELL RIVER), HELD IN PERSON AND ELECTRONICALLY AT 7:30 PM, ON TUESDAY, June 17, 2025

Present K. Eddy, Chair; C. Gillis, Vice-Chair; S. Briggs, J. Gladish, D. Hagen, D. Harper, J. McMann Trustees; P. Cizmic, Associate Superintendent, G. Manning, Superintendent; and K. Patrick Secretary-Treasurer.

25-97 Call to Order/Chair's remarks

Board Chair Eddy called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. Eddy noted the end of the school year, thanking retiring staff.

25-98 Superintendent's remarks

Superintendent Manning highlighted upcoming transitions and celebrations including high school commencement and recognition ceremonies as well as retiring staff.

25-99 Approval of the minutes of May 27, 2025

It was proposed by D. Hagen, seconded by S. Briggs and CARRIED:

THAT the minutes of the meeting of May 27, 2025 are hereby approved as submitted.

25-100 Additions to the agenda

12D Approval of amended 2025-26 capital plan (K. Patrick)

16A Request from CR Early Years Council (J. McMann)

25-101 Approval of the agenda

It was proposed by C. Gillis, seconded by J. MCMann and CARRIED:

THAT the agenda is hereby approved as amended.

25-102 Report from the June 17, 2025 Confidential Board Meeting

Vice-Chair Gillis reported general statements of matters discussed in the Board's Confidential Meeting, and in accordance with Section 72(3) of the School Act, reports the following:

- Teaching, administrative and support staff changes;
- 2. Property, legal and financial issues.

25-103 Annual budget bylaw for the fiscal year 2025-2026

Secretary-Treasurer Patrick shared that no further feedback had been received on the preliminary budget for the fiscal year 2025-2026 since the May 27, 2025 board meeting and presented it for final reading.

It was proposed by J Gladish, seconded by S. Briggs and CARRIED:

THAT the Annual Budget Bylaw in the amount of \$92,234,938 for the fiscal year 2025/2026, pursuant to section 113 of the School Act, be and is hereby read for the third time, passed and adopted.

25-104 Trustee travel per diem recommendation

Secretary-Treasurer Patrick shared a review of the Trustee travel per diem rates. The BC School Trustees Association (BCSTA) annually collects data from all BC school districts to set the BCSTA per diem rate and allow boards to compare rates. Board governance policy 24: Board member remuneration and expense allowance, indicates that per diem amounts should follow BCSTA rates. CRDTA rates are bargained. CUPE rates are tied to the provincial government rate.

It was proposed by D. Harper, seconded by S. Briggs and CARRIED:

THAT the Board approve the adjustments to the per diem rates as outlined in the summary provided by Secretary-Treasurer Patrick.

25-105 Trustee remuneration recommendation

Secretary-Treasurer Patrick presented the recommendations for Trustee compensation for 2025-2026. The district's formula for Trustee compensation was developed by an independent committee in 2007. A review is conducted looking at compensation rates for other island districts and applying a per student factor to average compensation in order to remain responsive to changing district enrolment.

It was proposed by D. Harper, seconded by D. Hagen and CARRIED:

THAT the Board recommends an adjustment to Trustee compensation as per the formula adopted by the Board in 2007 which is reviewed on an annual basis and will take effect on July 1st of the new fiscal year.

25-106 2025-26 capital plan amendment

Secretary-Treasurer Patrick shared an amended 2025-26 capital plan response letter from the Ministry.

It was proposed by J. McMann, seconded by J. Gladish and CARRIED:

THAT the Capital Plan Bylaw No. 2025/26 CPSD72-02 for projects identified in the May 15, 2025 Capital Plan response letter from the Ministry of Education and Child Care be given all three readings at this meeting.

THAT the Capital Plan Bylaw No. 2025/26 CPSD72-02 for projects identified in the May 15, 2025 Capital Plan response letter from the Ministry of Education and Child Care is hereby read for the first time.

It was proposed by J. Gladish, seconded by S. Briggs and CARRIED:

THAT the Capital Plan Bylaw No. 2025/26 CPSD72-02 for projects identified in the May 15, 2025 Capital Plan response letter from the Ministry of Education and Child Care is hereby read for the second time.

It was proposed by C. Gillis, seconded by D. Harper and **CARRIED**:

THAT the Capital Plan Bylaw No. 2025/26 CPSD72-02 for projects identified in the May 15, 2025 Capital Plan response letter from the Ministry of Education and Child Care is hereby read for the third time, passed and adopted.

25-107 Child care update

Associate Superintendent Cizmic reported that 2024-25 saw the opening of seven child care centres in Phase 1 of the integration of child care services in the district. For Phase 2 the district is hoping to develop four additional sites.

25-108 Carihi fire update

Superintendent Manning outlined the projected schedule for the ongoing repair and remediation of Carihi following the fire there on November 21, 2024. Four new portables, one, possibly two portables from other district sites and a mobile camp kitchen will be installed and prepared for use in September over the summer. The school will be active construction site through the summer.

25-109 Finance Warrant No. 11, May 31, 2025

It was proposed by D. Hagen, seconded by D. Harper and CARRIED:

THAT the Finance Warrant No. 11 dated May 31, 2025 be accepted as presented.

25-110 2026-2027 Major capital plan application

Secretary-Treasurer Patrick described the items included in the application summary.

It was proposed by C. Gillis, seconded by J. McMann and CARRIED:

THAT in accordance with provisions under section 142 (4) of the School Act, the Board of Education of School District No. 72 (Campbell River) hereby approves the proposed Capital Plan (Major Capital Programs) for 2026/27, as provided on the Capital Plan Summary for 2026/27 submitted to the Ministry of Education and Child Care.

25-111 June 4, 2025 Audit committee

Trustee Briggs reported that she and Trustee Harper met with the Audit committee online on June 4, 2025. Auditor Graham Roberts, from MNP LLP gave an overview of how the annual audit will be conducted.

25-112 June 5, 2025 VISTA planning committee

Vice Chair Gillis shared that together with Trustees Gladish and McMann, the VISTA planning committee met on June 5, 2025. The committee shared the conference theme of "Pathways to Success" and continue their work on the conference program and speakers.

25-113 **June 16, 2025 CORE pro-d committee**

Trustee Gladish shared her impressions from June 16, 2025 CORE pro-d planning committee.

25-114 Request from CR Early Years Council

Trustee McMann asked for follow up on the requests made by the CR Early Years Council at the April 29 board meeting.

25-115 Questions from anyone present on agenda Items for this meeting

Question 1 - CRDTA President Debra Coombes: I couldn't hear the back and forth on per diem rates.

Secretary-Treasurer Patrick responded that the posted per diem rates are the same. The mileage rate has increased.

Question 2 – CRDTA President Debra Coombes: I'm wondering why the remuneration motion says April and it's for July 1?

Secretary-Treasurer Patrick responded that April is when BCSTA provides published data. Our fiscal year starts July 1 so that is when rates change.

Question 3 – CRDTA President Debra Coombes: I'm noticing we almost never have correspondence or is there a criteria for this?

Board Chair Eddy responded that nothing has come recently. Some other boards have different practices.

Question 4 – Anonymous (online): When do you expect the new child care centres to open?

Associate Superintendent Philip Cizmic responded that it is too early to tell but hoping in a year and a half.

Financial Audit

The financial statement audit and reporting for the 2024-25 fiscal year is nearing completion.

As referenced on *Schedule 2* (attached), we experienced a deficit of \$1,359,365 for the past year end (or 1.8% of our budget) while our final budget forecasted a deficit of \$1,635,390. Although this is slightly under spent, the larger concern is that it still used our full unrestricted reserve.

Fiscal 24/25 was a tough year for SD 72. The final budgeted deficit increased from a balanced preliminary budget to a deficit of \$1,635,390. This was due to lower enrollment and the drastic increases in employee benefits. Since COVID inflationary pressures have increased premium costs much greater than the funding provided.

The end result is that our deficit decreased our reserves from \$2,622,431 to \$1,263,066.

Financial Reserves

Attached is our draft breakdown of the reserve financial activity during the 24/25 year. A copy of the proposed internally restricted reserves are attached for board approval.

The Board's Governance Policy 26 Accumulated Operating Surplus states: "the emergency contingency shall be maintained at two percent of prior year revenues and any use of the contingency shall only be reimbursed through accumulated unrestricted surplus or through the annual budget".

The auditor recommends a 2-4% contingency reserve, however, we feel a 2% reserve goal is sufficient considering our recent financial results. A reserve percentage of 2% of our budget represents one week of school district operations.

Considering the rebuilding of the emergency contingency, the senior management team is recommending reducing the internally restricted reserves to maintain the emergency contingency. To support this we are recommending moving \$63,969 from the international program and \$31,703 from IT equipment to restore the emergency contingency. Another \$50,000 will be moved from the IT equipment reserve to boost strategic priorities. The remaining \$100,000 reserve in IT will be sufficient, along with the increased IT equipment operating budget, to support 25/26 equipment purchases.

Two percent of the prior year revenues (*Schedule 2*) is \$1,547,127. The proposal is to retain the emergency contingency at \$832,878 which is 1% of revenues and work toward rebuilding both the unrestricted and emergency contingency in the future when the funds support it.

Considering the current financial position of the board and the uncertainties with enrollment and increases in benefits, senior management is recommending conservative additions to the internally restricted reserves for 24/25.

The following items are proposed for restriction in the 2023/24 financial statements:

- School supplies will be maintained to support the summer purchasing plans
- International Program is retaining \$90,000 that was committed to balance the 25/26 operating budget. There will not be a risk contingency available for the International Program in 25/26.
- Emergency contingency will be maintained at the 23/24 amount of 832,878. This was maintained by transferring or reducing reserves from other historically restricted accounts.
- Indigenous Program funding is restricted by the Ministry of Education to be spent on the indigenous program. Any unspent funds must be carried forward as an unrestricted reserve for the next year.
- The CIMS replacement amount of \$50,000 will continue to accrue with additional annual contributions until an implementation budget is reached. Replacement of CIMS is a growing risk item in SD 72 and is one of our priorities to complete. However, it was felt that the funds are not available for the 24/25 year end. We expect we will need to accrue \$300,000 at which point we will consider replacing the system.

New proposals for 24/25:

- There are no new proposals for 24/25.
- Strategic Priorities received a minor reserve increase to support district initiatives in schools. Literacy, Numeracy, district assessments and leadership growth areas are supported by the strategic priorities fund.

Considering the recommendations, internally restricted reserves will be \$1,263,066 and the unrestricted reserves will be \$0.

Based on all factors considered above, the Board Officers would recommend the following for our reserves for 2024/25 (see attached draft):

ACCUMULATED OPERATING SURPLUS

The Board of Education recognizes the value and security of having an accumulated operating surplus. While the board strives to address spending priorities during the budget process it acknowledges that underspending may occur and a surplus may result. A surplus can provide a positive educational benefit through the restriction of its use for specific functions. An unrestricted surplus can be used to sustain annual operations when extraordinary events lead to a loss of revenue or an increase in costs.

The School Board may choose to use the unrestricted surplus to balance an annual budget when there is a projected annual deficit. The *School Act* requires boards of education to prepare a balanced annual budget and does not allow boards to run a deficit.

Unrestricted Operating Surplus:

Up to one third of the unrestricted surplus may be used during the annual budget to balance the preliminary operating budget.

Internally Restricted Operating Surplus:

The Board may restrict the use of unrestricted surplus for a specific purpose. The purposes for which:

- can only be used for expenditures which do not sustain on-going services and that do not exceed three years;
- can be used for emergent items that were not able to be included in the budget process that are greater than \$10,000;
- the emergency contingency shall be maintained at two percent of prior year revenues and any
 use of the contingency shall only be reimbursed through accumulated unrestricted surplus or
 through the annual budget.

The board will ensure it manages its surplus in a transparent and accountable manner by:

- using feedback gathered from the preliminary budget process for the preliminary budget when considering new restricted reserves;
- ensuring that any consultation includes stakeholders and Indigenous rights holders;
- having management prepare and the board approve the budget annually;
- passing the budget by board motion, in a public board meeting;
- clearly identifying and categorizing surplus items as:
 - o restricted due to the nature of constraints on the funds;
 - o restricted for anticipated unusual expenses identified by the board; and
 - o restricted for operations spanning multiple school years.
- posting the previous year restricted reserve activity on the public website; and
- including a detailed list in the financial statement notes.

Local Capital

can be transferred to the capital accumulated surplus only if the purpose is identified.

At any time during the fiscal year, the board may approve expenses that are drawn from the unrestricted surplus that had not previously been included in the internally restricted surplus.
