



CROSS CATCHMENT TRANSFER

Applications for Cross Catchment transfers are due for consideration by the last Friday in February (February 27th), Please note that students must be registered in their area school before applying for a Cross Catchment Transfer. The forms can be found on the District website. This also applies if your child will be going into the English Program at Phoenix or Southgate rather than continuing in the French program at Phoenix.

French Immersion Transfer

Moving a student from one program to another requires careful consideration. The French Immersion program is inclusive of all learners and school teams work to support all students so that they successfully complete the French Immersion program. A student or parent can request to move out of the French Immersion program by speaking with the school principal (or a school counsellor at middle or secondary school).

Kindergarten Registration 2026/2027

Kindergarten registration will take place February 2nd—February 6th.

Please pass this on to anyone you know with a Kindergarten age child. You will need a Birth Certificate, Care Card and proof of address. Registrations will be accepted online or at the school. Even if you already have a child at EWP, please register your Kindergarten child by the deadline as well.



UPDATE ON BATTLE OF THE BOOKS IN ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

As some of you may be aware, elementary library programs are being delivered differently. Teacher librarians are now providing prep coverage for classroom teachers, which changes how library time is scheduled and supported. Because of this shift, we will not be running Battle of the Books this year.

We know this news may be disappointing for students who enjoy the program. Battle of the Books has been a valued literacy experience for many years, and we appreciate the excitement it has brought to students and families. Staff will be using this year to explore how the program might continue in the future in a way that is sustainable, including looking at coordination and funding needs.

Battle of the Books will continue in middle schools. Grade 5 students will have the opportunity to participate in Battle of the Books when they enter middle school next year.

Our commitment to literacy remains strong. Students will continue to be supported through classroom learning and library programs that promote reading, inquiry, and a love of books.
