

## **BEWARE OF BATS!**

About 10% of bats in British Columbia are infected with Rabies. Rabies is a virus that is spread to humans from sick bats through bites, scratches, saliva or touching. Rabies is a serious disease and **will** cause death if not treated quickly.

To prevent Rabies:

- Vaccinate your pet dogs or cats.
- Do not touch bats... ever.
- If you are bitten or scratched by a bat, wash the wound well with soap and water.
- If you find a bat in your house, leave the room right away. Call the Communicable Disease Program or <u>HealthLinkBC</u> at 8-1-1 (a free call).
- If you have <u>any</u> contact with a bat, including situations when a bat is in the room and you cannot exclude any possible bite, scratch or mucous membrane exposure (e.g. in a room with a bat, sleeping in a room/tent with a bat), <u>immediately</u> call the Island Health Communicable Disease Program, or go to the nearest hospital for a Rabies vaccination.
