PARKING LOT

As we work together to make sure our school is safe and welcoming for everyone, we'd like to ask all families to follow a few important safety rules during drop-off and pick-up times. Our parking lot is a busy place before school and at the end of the day. Please pay attention to the signs in the parking lot and painted on the parking lot. These signs are in place to support traffic flow and to help make sure everyone stays safe. There is a drop off lane and a drive through lane and families crossing in between. Please be alert to children and families who are walking from their car to the entrance of the school. We want everyone to get to school safely.

Also, we have designated accessible parking spaces for students, staff or guests with mobility challenges who require close access to the building. To support an inclusive and accessible school environment, we ask that accessible parking spaces are used only when a person with a mobility issue is entering or exiting the vehicle, and the vehicle displays a valid accessible parking permit.
