Do you have students who have difficulty writing, or who struggle reading? Do literacy skills impact the completion of assignments?

This workshop explores many built-in and free reading and writing tools to support literacy. Whether a student is working on a laptop or an iPad, these tools can help them access information, make annotations, and create their own writing. Some supports include dictation, predictive text, text-to-speech, annotation of PDFs, and the reduction of visual distractions from websites.

These are tools that will benefit all students. Come explore them with us. This is a hands-on workshop. Laptops and iPads will be available to use.

This framework allows teachers to create a management plan that is based on positive behaviour support but is flexible to accommodate many strategies and teaching styles. Included is the opportunity to re-examine personal practice and beliefs, explore respectful discipline approaches and expand classroom management strategies.
