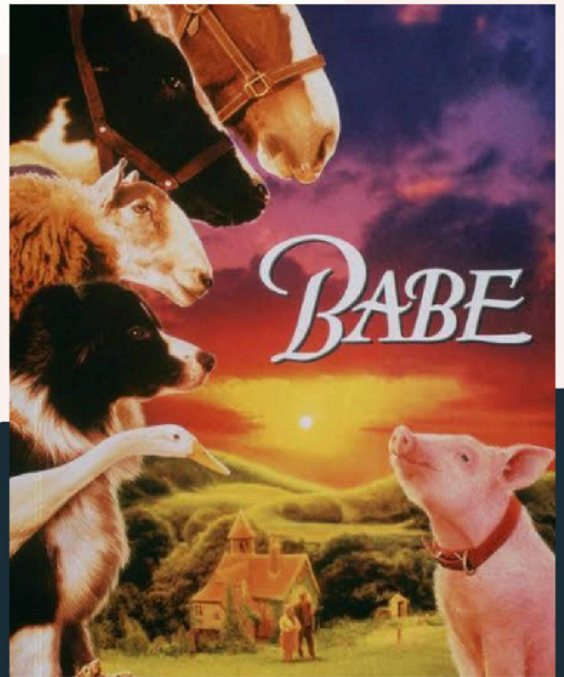

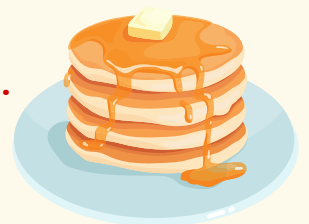

Kindergarten

Starting kindergarten is an exciting milestone, but we know it can also create some anxiety for both children and parents. We want to help ease some of those worries! This flyer provides some simple ways that you, as a parent, can help prepare your child for kindergarten and some information about what you can expect.

HOW TO PREPARE

As a parent or caregiver you can help your child get ready for kindergarten by:

- Staying positive and cheerful. Talk to your child about the exciting things they will learn.
- Practicing putting on and taking off shoes, packing and unpacking bags.
- Working on zippers, velcro, laces, buttons, snaps and other fasteners on clothing and bags.
- Encouraging independence in opening and closing food containers, using a fork and spoon, peeling fruit and wiping up spills.
- Allowing your child to become independent with bathroom routines in various settings.
- Teaching other basic hygiene like how to cover their mouth when they cough and how to blow their nose and put the tissue in the garbage.
- Choosing a backpack that your child can easily carry, open and close.
- Choosing shoes that your child can safely wear on the playground and in the gym.



We understand gradual entry can be challenging for families with childcare.
Thank you for helping us support your child's positive start to school!

TIPS FOR A GOOD START

As the start of school gets closer and as it starts in September:

- Visit the school over the summer to play on the playground. This will help your child start to feel comfortable on the school grounds.
- Keep food choices simple when packing their snack and lunch.
- Cut up fruit vegetables and sandwiches into bite size pieces.
- After the first day, make your goodbye cheerful and brief. Don't come back after your goodbye and don't slip away unnoticed! Let your child know that you'll be waiting when school ends, and be sure to be on time for pick up!

WHY GRADUAL ENTRY?

Gradual entry eases the transition to school by:

- Setting the foundation for a comfortable and secure beginning to your child's school career.
- Giving children an opportunity to adjust to their teacher, classroom, and peers in a smaller group and for a shorter period of time.
- Providing time for a "welcome" conversation between the child, parent and teacher. You can begin to get to know each other and share important information about your child.
- Enabling the teacher to work with small groups of children in order to build positive relationships, familiarize students with classroom routines and introduce basic procedures.

The school will provide more info about gradual entry and your child's entry schedule.



DIPTAR OF FAZ

OUR BELIEFS AROUND FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN



Respectful relationships with children and their families are vital.

We create an environment that is welcoming, nurturing, safe and respectful for children and their families.



Most learning in the kindergarten program occurs during play.

All children have potential to learn.

We take children from "where they are" developmentally and help them take their next steps.



Through play-based exploration and inquiry the kindergarten program supports development of communication, thinking, and personal and social responsibility. (BC Curriculum Core Competencies)

Learning environments foster respect for all learners.

- All students will have opportunity to better understand and respect a variety of cultures, both their own and others.
- Indigenous perspectives are an important part of the historical foundation of BC and Canada and are integrated into the curriculum. (BC Curriculum Parent Guide)



Oral language and other forms of representing are the foundations of literacy.

These beliefs were co-created prior to the implementation of full-day Kindergarten in British Columbia with our early learning, Indigenous, and School District 72 communities.



Early French Immersion

The early French Immersion program is a district program housed in two elementary schools, École des Deux Mondes and École Willow Point, aimed to develop functional bilingualism in students whose first language is not French. While parents can indicate a preference of which school they would like their child to attend, enrollment is dependent upon space and staffing considerations.

WHAT IS EARLY IMMERSION?

- Students acquire second language skills by undertaking an extensive study of the language and by receiving instruction in French in other subjects.
- In the early elementary years (K-3) French is the language of instruction. Students are encouraged to interact in French for all school-related activities.
- English language arts is introduced as a subject in grade 4 and in grades 4 and 5, 80 percent of the instruction is given in French.
- The curriculum parallels the English language program. Children are expected to develop the same level of competence in academic, social and physical skills as their counterparts in the English program.

WHO IS IMMERSION FOR?

- Early French Immersion is a program of choice, open to all children entering kindergarten.
- While most French Immersion students come from English-speaking homes, a small number come from homes where neither English or French is the primary language.
- There is no selection criteria or special fees for registration.

IMMERSION IN GRADES 6-12

After grade 5, early French Immersion students continue to middle school (grades 6-8) at École Phoenix Middle School and secondary school (grades 9-12) at Carihi Secondary School.

- In middle school, students in early French Immersion receive 80 percent of their instruction in French. Courses include French language arts, math, science and social studies.
- Starting in grade 9 the instruction in French decreases gradually each year until grade 12.

Common Questions

Will my child receive the same quality of education in the Immersion program?

Yes. Both programs follow identical curriculum from the Ministry of Education.

Will my child adapt to a class where no English is spoken?

Yes. Children adapt very easily. Those who are very confident begin using the language right away. Others need more of an initiation period. As their confidence builds, they begin to interact more in French.

Will my child keep up in their English language development?

Yes. Language mechanisms are taught in both English language arts and French Immersion. Skills learned in French language arts tend to strengthen first language skills and vice-versa.

How can I help my child at home?

At the early elementary level, parents can encourage their children by demonstrating an active interest in their language learning. Parents should continue to read with their child in English. As children progress through intermediate years, continue to take an active role in your child's education.

Cross Catchment Application Information

Cross Catchment Transfers

Parents who would like their child to attend a different school instead of their catchment school need to submit an application for cross catchment transfer (SD72 Form 302-1) **by 4:00 p.m. on Friday, February 27, 2026** by uploading it as part of their online registration in MyEd or emailing it to student.registration@sd72.bc.ca.

Kindergarten students **MUST** be registered at their catchment school **BEFORE** submitting an application for cross catchment transfer, except for those students with siblings already in attendance and who will still be in attendance in September at their requested school. In these instances, parents **DO NOT** need to fill out an application for cross catchment transfer verifying sibling status, but they are requested to register their child by Friday, February 6, 2026.

The associate superintendents' office will notify cross catchment transfer applicants as to whether their application has been approved or not by the end of April.

Students can submit a late application by the second Friday in May. Those that submit after the last Friday in February but before the second Friday in May will have their application processed no later than the end of the school year where possible. Those that apply after the May deadline will be processed before the first day of school where possible, but they may not be processed until the first week of school in September.

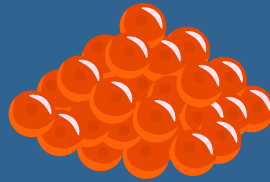

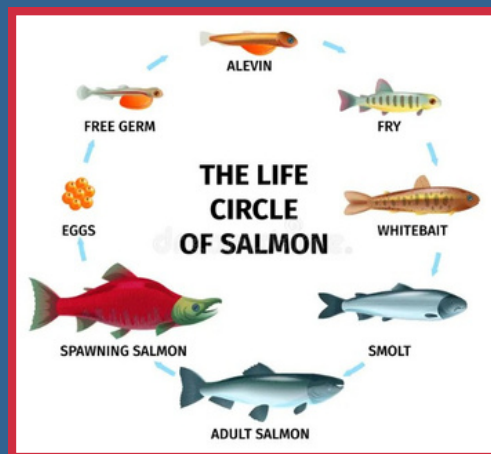
DONATION JAR

So far, about half of the eggs in Mrs. Zumach's room have hatched into alevin. The eggs in the library haven't started hatching yet, but we expect this to happen soon.

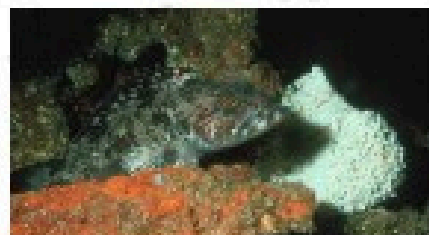
Many classes are learning about the different types of salmon, the stages of the salmon lifecycle and the importance of salmon to our ecosystems around Campbell River.



We look forward to observing our fish as they grow in the coming weeks.



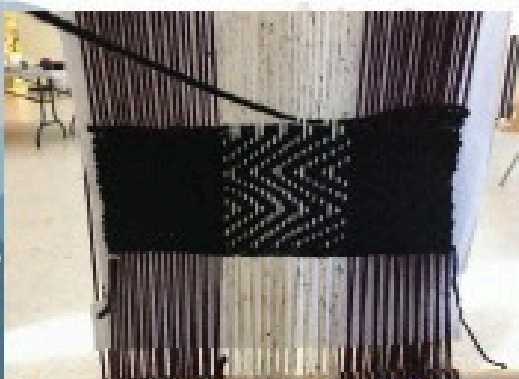

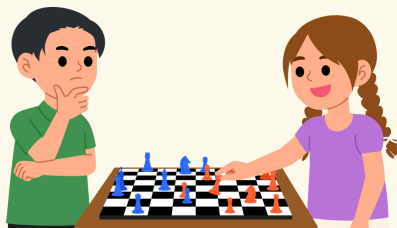
Short moon - čičlā tagam

playing chess to help with judging.

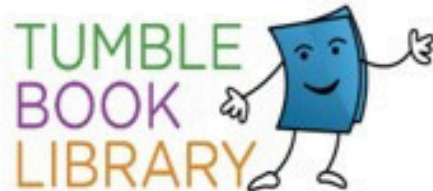
