SD72 Kwakwala and Likwala Bilingual K-2 Programs

School District 72 is excited to offer the K^wak^wala and Lik^wala bilingual programs, housed in Ripple Rock Elementary, aimed to develop K^wak^wala and Lik^wala bilingual speakers. The classroom teachers and language and culture teachers work together to create an environment where students can learn, play and grow in K^wak^wala and Lik^wala.

Next year there will be classes offered in kindergarten through grade 2. enrollment is dependent upon space and staffing considerations.

All information about the program can be found on the school district website. Families can register online or at their neighbourhood school (call to make an appointment).

If interested, please let your school know you have an interest in the district program and ask for an expression of interest form.



Fieldtrips & Parent Participation

Parent/guardian volunteers are now permitted to accompany classrooms on fieldtrips (at the discretion of the teacher). However, there are certain documents required prior to parents/guardians being permitted to participate.

Criminal Record Check - this form is required for any person accompanying students on a fieldtrip. A completed volunteer registration form must accompany the CRC (so that the processing fee is waived). Once completed, these forms are to be dropped off directly to the RCMP office in Campbell River. Blank forms are available from the school office. Criminal Record Checks are valid for a period of three years. Please note this process may take several weeks and participation on fieldtrips is not permitted until the process has been finalized and the completed check has been received by the school office.

Driver Information Form - this form is required if teachers elect to have parent drivers (rather than using a school bus) on a fieldtrip AND you are transporting students not related to you. This requires completion of three items:

- * Driver Information Form (blank form available from school office);
- * Photocopy of Driver's License ("N" drivers may not transport students); and
- * Driver's Abstract. *To obtain Abstract <u>online</u>: www.icbc.com, select "get your driving record or abstract" and request email to:

oceangrove@sd72.bc.ca (a copy can also be sent to your email)

The Driver Information form is valid for a period of <u>one</u> year. Paperwork can be completed within 24 hours.

If you are unsure whether you have current documents, please ask your child's teacher.





SPRING INTO SPRING

Island Health recognizes the importance of daily physical activity. Are your children getting 60 minutes of physical activity a day?

"Together, we can make active travel, like walking, cycling or taking transit, part of our school Routine—for the good of our physical and mental health and our communities."

Spring is a great time to think about walking and wheeling to school. What a wonderful way to enjoy the smells and sights of spring!

- Active travel to and from school helps children and youth meet the goal of at least 60 minutes per day of moderate to vigorous physical activity. It also helps build life-long healthy habits.
- It's a great time to think about forming new habits. Only 9% of Canadian kids aged 5 to 17 get the 60 minutes of heart-pumping activity they need each day (2016 ParticipACTION Report Card).
- Talk with parents about getting kids walking and cycling together.
- For younger children, physical literacy skills such as balancing, hopping and jumping can be developed on the walk to school.
