# **Next Year Student School Supplies**

We will once again be purchasing bulk student school supplies for September, and asking that families pay \$40.00 (all grades) per student to cover the cost.

The bulk order of supplies is purchased from a local company and ensures that consistent quality of exact items is provided for classroom use.



Please note, we will not be requesting payment from students until the end of August.

An email will be sent to all Ocean Grove families just before September start-up, requesting payment and providing full details on the payment options.

With lots of outdoor activities, we are noticing an increased number of minor student injuries due to inappropriate footwear.

We strongly suggest that students wear runners or sandals (with heel straps), for running, playing outside, and fieldtrips. Safety first!

- report cards, and more!



# 2024 - 2025 Student Bus Passes

Bus pass applications for the Fall have been opened on the district website using this link: <a href="Student Transportation(sd72.bc.ca">Student Transportation(sd72.bc.ca</a>)

The **application deadline** to ensure approved ridership bus passes are available at school start-up is **June 30th**. Ensure that you are selecting the correct year in the drop-down menu.

Please do not duplicate applications. One application per child is sufficient. If you feel that you have made an error, please call the Transportation Dept.

The Transportation Dept. has noted that there have been an extraordinary amount of lost bus passes this year, so students are reminded to keep care of their passes to ensure seamless rid-

ership throughout the school year.

The policy of MUST HAVE a bus pass to ride the school bus will be strictly enforced in the Fall, and will likely be in full effect by the end of September.
