

Outdoor Education is a PE 11 /12 consisting of:

- Physical fitness
- Leadership
- Trip Planning
- With skills development in:
 - Canoe handling and safety
 - Winter backcountry travel with avalanche course
 - Long distance, multi-day backpacking travel
 - Wilderness ethics
 - Group dynamics
 - First aid
 - Wildlife interaction training
 - Skiing, snow shoeing, biking, climbing

Comparative Cultures 12 We visit the great places in history, where generations of people shaped the great civilizations and cultures with religion, art, architecture, philosophy, technology, music and adventure over the past 2500 years. Explore the birth of the great civilizations of the past right to our world of today!

Physical Geography 12 Here, we use science to explore the charted and uncharted places on our planet all the while learning how we, as humans, fit into this global adventure story. We do hands on studies of locations, environments, resources, and people, locally and internationally.

English 11/12 Our focus is on broad Humanities outcomes with key literary examples drawn from Tolkien's Middle Earth, and Shakespeare's plays, to local and international writers. Our topics include: folklore and mythology, contemporary issues, technology, the origin of languages, and the power of writing short stories and essays.
