Celebrating Student Learning!




Hello Parents and Caregivers,






Students came out


Ms. Doherty's class engaged in many 100's day activities & enjoyed a wonderful celebration together!



Students in Mrs. Baker's and Mrs. Kennedy's class did some writing on what their life might be like "When I am 100 years old ...










Please note:

Meet our Music Teacher

Read below and visit the music room on Student-led conference day to find out what our students have been exploring in Music?



Ms. Dearham, our music teacher this year, has been using creative ways to develop our students' skills and knowledge while also further nurturing their love of music. Currently, the theme is **Peter and the Wolf**. Ms Dearham shared that, "Peter and the Wolf is an iconic part of childhood and was one of my favourite memories from my own elementary school experience. It was written to teach children to recognize different instruments, the parts of the orchestra (string, woodwind, brass, & percussion) as well as how music can be used to express mood and tell a story."

Feedback is how we learn especially if the feedback is descriptive

Years of research including current research shows that **descriptive feedback is the most powerful way we can improve student learning**. Below is an invitation for you to imagine the process of learning something new. It is followed by how we use the same big ideas in our classrooms at Pinecrest.

Imagine....

At this point, I don't know how to sail. I'm a 'not yet.' It's okay to be a 'not yet' at this time.

I want to learn to sail, though. So, I sign up to take lessons. With lots of coaching support, practice and encouragement from an instructor who clearly know the steps to success, I am gradually gaining skills and confidence. As my teacher gives me feedback, I am beginning to understand the skills and knowledge that are required for success. I am not independent yet, and that's okay. Gradually, I am 'approaching expectations.'

Eventually, as I gain greater skill and confidence, I will be ready to safely sail on my own. At that point, I will have 'fully met expectations.'

Maybe someday I will be able to sail more challenging waters and help to coach others. At that point, I will have 'gone **beyond expectations**.'

It is the same with our students...

It is okay for them to be at different points along the continuum as they learn new things. With patient & skilled coaching, practice, and encouragement they should be able to move successfully forward, to grow and develop.

In the 'real world', coaching sometimes looks different than in the 'school world.' The soccer coach, for example, does not generally give evaluative feedback such as, "You're not meeting expectations" or "You're a C+."

Instead, she observes the players in action, notices "what's working" and gives feedback for the next steps for improved skill and play. The players then get time to practice and receive ongoing feedback until they've got it. Then, they work towards the next goal.

As teachers, we are the observers and analysts, the coach, the one with the expertise to notice what each of our students are doing well and identifying the next steps to further their learning along. With our support – modeling, providing opportunities for practice and ongoing feedback, helping our students understand what success looks like so that they can begin to monitor their own learning... our students will gain skills, knowledge, independence, and confidence.

We see parents as our partners supporting your child's learning together!
